DEFENDING CHAMP, GM VAR AKOBIAN, LEADS AFTER 4

Defending National Open Champion, GM Varuzhan Akobian, stands all alone going into the final day's play, on 4/4.

In round 3 Akobian notched up a simple victory against Canadian FM, Eric Hansen, and in round 4, he rode his Vegas luck a little more to beat GM Mikheil Kekelidze.







This year we are once again privileged to have 6-time US Champion, GM Walter Browne, participating and giving special lectures that are free to attend. (His next one is at 6:30 pm on Sunday evening in Napa C.)

Here is Browne's round 3 encounter with the secondseed in the event, Russian GM Pavel Tregubov.

A new move according to Chess-Base. Both 12.h4 and: 12.Nxc6 have been played here previously, the latter with more success.


The more aesthetically pleasing 14...Qxc6 was rejected Tregubov for some reason.

15.Bd4 Bb7 16.g5 hxg5 17.Qxg5 0-0-0

Possibly knowing that he was going to castle this side was the reason for the previous capture on c6 with the pawn back on move 14.

18.Bc4 Nd7 19.Qxg7

19.h4 was an interesting idea leaving Black the question of whether to defend the g-pawn.



22.Qg5

22.Bc3!? Bxc3 (22...Bc7? 24.Rxd7+-) 23.Bxe6! fxe6 23.Nxc3 Rhg8 24.Qxg8 Rxg8 25.Rxg8+ Kc7 26.Rg3 and white is better here.

Now follows a series of exchanges leading to total equality.


